<p>Year in Review</p>	<p>John began the review of 2025 by recapping our four main objectives as an Association: member advocacy with the city, serve as a resource, build a sense of community and grow participation/awareness of pickleball. Overall, we want to identify and arrange for affordable places to play pickleball for the Etobicoke community.</p> <p>He noted that pickleball continues to experience strong participation growth and there are now numerous options for players including more clubs, more tournaments and more city investment in courts.</p> <p>John outlined how EPA forges relationships with the city including presenting to City Staff on a regular basis and sitting on City boards (Pickleball Advisory Group (John)/Centennial Park Stakeholders Committee (Brenda)). EPA was also asked by Councillor V. Crisanti to participate in the launch of the upgraded courts in his ward (Kingsview Park).</p> <p>Pickleball exclusive outdoor court locations now exist in Valleyfield Park, Eglinton Flats, Kingsview Park, Martingrove Gardens and Laburnham Park.</p> <p>Brenda presented an update on the Centennial Park pickleball courts. Twelve new courts will open Spring of 2026.</p> <p>EPA has submitted a partnership application (financial contribution) to upgrade the courts to an acrylic surface, vs the originally planned asphalt surface, as well as the installation of windscreens.</p> <p>In addition, EPA has submitted a permit request to secure courts for EPA members. The permit proposes a shared-use approach with public access including sharing the number of courts and court time.</p>	<p>Awaiting confirmation of partnership application</p> <p>Awaiting feedback from City on permit application</p>	<p>Brenda (April '26)</p> <p>Brenda (April '26)</p>
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	<p>Beckie reviewed the success of the EPA@Fairgrounds program: EPA ran six series, with 19 sessions per series and over 700 players per series. Over 4200 registrations were recorded in 2025.</p> <p>She additionally updated the group that there may be a new condo developer once again attached to Cloverdale Mall however any impact is at least 5 years away.</p> <p>Fairgrounds will also be upgrading their facility including new (and more) courts, upgraded surface, new court dividers and a new lounge/gym area.</p> <p>John recapped the numerous activities EPA delivers over the year to grow participation and community including: four tournaments, four leagues, special events as well as training sessions for approximately 500 players throughout the year.</p> <p>Additional activities include: First Aid training for EPA members, support of the OSGA 55+ Sr Games and participation in media requests (CBC)</p> <p>The number of EPA members reached 2195 in 2025 driven by ongoing interest in pickleball, successful programming and EPA's partnership with Fairgrounds.</p> <p>J. 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<p>Treasurer's Report B. Pusateri</p>	<p>Bonnie presented the financial statement as of Dec. 31 – 2025. All financial reporting is overseen by a chartered accountant to ensure all essential government filings are met and processed.</p> <p>Our net income for 2025 was \$73,908 compared to \$78,417 in 2024.</p> <p>Gross revenue was \$409,684 sourced from membership registrations, sponsorships, tournaments, training, drop-in programming and multiweek programs (e.g. Fairgrounds).</p> <p>Expenses of \$335,776 were driven by event and admin fees including: gym rentals, Fairgrounds court rentals, training, tournaments, insurance, website hosting, banking, Stripe, Playtime Scheduler and CourtReserve.</p> <p>John reviewed the importance of having a reserve fund to hedge against potential court fee cost increases and allow for future investment and partnerships within the Etobicoke pickleball community.</p> <p>As outlined earlier a portion of the reserve fund is earmarked for a contribution to the installation of an acrylic surface and windscreens at the new Centennial Park courts.</p> <p>Additional investment under consideration: additional windscreens in popular courts, increased tournament prize spending and ongoing contribution to the City of Toronto to maintain state of good repair of courts.</p> <p>J. Their willingness to show up, pitch in, and support our events is the reason our community continues to grow and EPA is successful.</p> <p>We are equally grateful to all of our community sponsors that allow us to invest in programming and events that benefit our membership.</p> <p>Highlights include: ongoing programming, potential new partnerships with other clubs, building out our leadership team and continued City advocacy.</p> <p>A question was raised regarding whether windscreens will be taken down over the winter. It is recommended that they be removed to ensure longevity and minimize wear and tear.</p> <p>A suggestion was made to add advanced training sessions.</p> <p>A question was asked regarding the possibility of EPA partnering with Pickleplex in Downsview. Given its location, this is not an option for EPA at this time.</p> <p>A question was raised as to whether the nets at Centennial Park will be removed for the winter. EPA has recommended they be removed to ensure longevity and minimize any potential damage.</p> <p>A request was made to try and improve the lighting at Martingrove Gardens and Valleyfield. It was suggested that members can call 311 and copy the relevant city councillor with any requests and EPA will supplement these requests in any discussions we have with City Staff.</p>	<p>John to investigate options</p>	<p>2026 season</p>
